



OHUDDLE YOUTH GROUP Field Trips

OHuddle Youth group meets regularly to provide students an opportunity to practice asset development in the community. OHuddle partners with local churches to showcase area youth group opportunities. Dinner and free admission to a local activity are provided on each night.

OHUDDLE 1:1 MENTORSHIP Available to students nominated by the school

OHuddle mentors are trained to support students with the "40 Developmental Assets," research-based practice to foster positive youth outcomes. Students; nominated by schools, meet with their mentor for 40 minutes weekly; but are also supported regularly by their Site Coordinators, who serve in their schools daily. Service Coordinator opportunities and progress monitoring ensure individualized programming for each student served.


OHuddle meets student food, clothing, and health needs through community partnerships and provides Case Management in partnership with Encompass and various other Mental Health providers.




